CHICAGO (10/18/16) – Members of the renowned Lyric Opera Orchestra will perform intimate works in <u>An Afternoon of Chamber Music</u> next month. The program, inspired by Lyric's new production of <u>The Magic Flute</u>, features works by Mozart including selections from the opera arranged for winds and his Quintet for Clarinet and Strings, K. 581.

The performance will take place at **St. James Cathedral** at 66 E. Huron Street in Chicago at 2p.m. on **Saturday, November 12**. General admission seating is \$25 and tickets are available <u>online</u>.

Selections from *The Magic Flute* for wind octet, arranged by Joseph Heidenreich, will be performed by Lyric Opera Orchestra members **Charlene Zimmerman** (clarinet), **Linda Baker** (clarinet), **Judith Kulb** (oboe), **Judith Zunamon Lewis** (oboe), **Lewis Kirk** (bassoon), **Preman Tilson** (bassoon), **Fritz Foss** (horn) and **Neil Kimel** (horn).

Quintet for Clarinet and Strings, K. 581 will feature Susan Warner (clarinet), Bing Jing Yu (violin), Ann Palen (violin), Terri Van Valkinburgh (viola), and Calum Cook (cello).

Music historian David Burch will give brief remarks on the works featured in this performance.
