...with the driver, if his first or last name is Richard, Ro(d)ger(s), Oscar, or Hammerstein		25
3. On a streetcar (hint: at the Chicago History Museum or the Illinois Railway Museum)	<i>Subscribers have the opportunity to see Renée Fleming in A Streetcar Named Desire in March/April – four performances only – very limited tickets remain!</i>	15

4. Holding a Werther's candy	<i>Werther, starring Matthew Polenzani and Sophie Koch (making her North American debut), opens Nov. 11.</i>	4
...while standing in front of the <i>Werther</i> banner outside the opera house		5

5. Giving a standing ovation next to or on the “Bravo” water taxi	<i>“Bravo!” is a exclamation of approval to acknowledge a well-done performance.</i>	10
6. Wearing a wedding veil	<i>In Don Pasquale (opening Nov. 25), an old man marries a younger woman; hilarity ensues.</i>	7
7. Eating a piece of opera cake (hint: Julius Meinl, Austrian Bakery, Artopolis, etc.)	<i>An opera cake is a French dessert noted for its delicate, intensely flavored layers -- possibly named as such because its many layers reminded patrons of separate operatic “acts.”</i>	5

8. Eating a gingerbread cookie	Hansel & Gretel -- <i>the classic fairytale of two hungry children who almost become the meal -- opens Dec. 7.</i>	3
9. With a Greek statue (multiple entries accepted for this one)	Elektra <i>is based on Sophocles's ancient greek tale of the same name.</i>	8
10. Any place in Chicago where opera has been performed (think beyond the Civic Opera House!)	<i>Chicago has been home to numerous opera companies, dating back to 1850 when a visiting troupe performed at Rice's Theater (near Randolph and Dearborn)</i>	10
11. Next to a "musical" street sign (i.e., Mozart St. -- multiple entries accepted)		5
12. Wearing a jester's hat	<i>Rigoletto, the story of the despised court jester, opens Feb. 25.</i>	5
13. In front of a "musical" park sign (i.e., Bell Park, Chopin Park -- multiple entries accepted)		5
14. Holding (or eating!) some Genoa salami	<i>Simon Boccanegra (onstage through Nov. 9) is set in Genoa, Italy. The pirate Boccanegra returns to his hometown and, against his wishes, is elected governor.</i>	4

15. Playing an instrument traditionally used in a mariachi band	<i>Lyric presents the Midwest premiere of the world's first mariachi opera, Cruzar la Cara de la Luna (To Cross the Face of the Moon), on Apr. 7, 2013</i>	8
16. In front of a French café or bistro	<i>Act 2 of La bohème (opening Jan. 21) takes place at Café Momus, in the Latin Quarter of Paris.</i>	6

17. Singing karaoke	<i>The story of Die Meistersinger von Nurnberg (opening Feb. 8) revolves around Hans Sachs and the guild of mastersingers – poets and musicians who pursue their craft according to traditions and rules.</i>	20
18. Posing passionately in front of one of the “Long Live Passion” billboards (hint: one is near Belmont & Racine)	<i>“Long Live Passion” is the tagline from Lyric’s recent advertising campaign.</i>	7
